

Safety and usage instructions - halogen and incandescent lamps

Danger! Halogen and incandescent lamps operate at extremely high temperatures that can exceed 500° C. These lamps can cause fires, serious physical injuries and property damage.

- Only use halogen and incandescent lamps in appropriate fixtures that can fully contain any parts of the lamps upon the event of a lamp burst.
- Do not use halogen and incandescent lamps in close proximity of curtains, textile, paper or other combustible materials that can cause a fire hazard.
- Do not touch the halogen and incandescent bulb surface with your bare hands. Oils from skin can lead to breakage or shorten the life of the lamp. Use a dry cloth or clean gloves for installation and removal.
- Do not look directly at the operating lamp; this may cause serious eye injury.
- Always turn off the current and let the lamp cool down before removing, inserting, or cleaning the lamp.
- Make sure halogen and incandescent lamps are used in appropriately rated fixtures, taking into account the min. and max. load. Misuse can lead to short circuit, fire, electrical shock, shortened lamp life, breakage or overheating of the fixture or the lamp. In doubt, contact the manufacturer of your light fixture.
